The Startup Heatmap Europe is brought to you by the *european startup initiative (esi)*. Founded in 2012, esi is a volunteer based non-profit organization, supported by the Allianz Cultural Foundation.

# The Survey

The Startup Heatmap Europe is based on an online survey opened to founders fom November 2015 to April 2016.

The main question: Where would you like to startup if you could begin all over again?

We came to our conclusions after collecting data from 700 founders.

#### **Key Highlights**

- Startup talent is hyper-mobile: Every 5<sup>th</sup> founder started abroad
- It's not all about money: Access to capital is the least important factor
- Differentiation is key: Hotspots for High-Tech vs. Internet startups



Startup founders are 5x more likely to move across borders than the average EU citizen.





# WHAT GETS THE FOUNDERS MOVING?



**TALENT** 

**71**%

Access to highly qualified talent is relevant or very relevant to the highest number of founders.



**ECO - SYSTEM** 

**69**%

Second is the quality of the ecosystem, though founders from high-tech startups rate it slightly higher than talent.



**COSTS** 

**51**%

Founders from low GDP per capita countries rated the costs more relevant as compared to founders from other countries.

Even though founders from high-tech startups rate access to capital higher it ranks overall least important.





We counted how often startup hubs are mentioned on relevant tech blogs and - guess what! *Media buzz is not enough to attract startup founders.* 




Manchester performs 18 ranks worse than media attention would suggest.




This shows the rank change when we only look at founders of high-tech companies with a high appreciation for access to capital.

### WHAT CAN THE GOVERNMENT DO?


The survey results suggest that **Economic Freedom** has a slightly positive effect on **Startup migration**.




- We analyzed in-depth 7 potential rising start up hubs, which were ranked between 7<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> according to the mentions on tech blogs.
- All survey participants answered questions concerning their **perception** of these startup hubs no matter whether they were experts on the ecosystems.
- What are the strengths and the weaknesses of these hubs? Who will rise in the ranks and who will fall?




- Regional champion for the Nordics followed by Copenhagen
- Strong image for High-Tech and Access to Talent
- Weaknesses with internet startups and high burnrate
- Competitors to watch: Zurich, Munich, Copenhagen




- Milan scores 16 ranks worse than media coverage suggests
- Italy loses 29 % of its startup population due to migration
- Relative good performance in High-Tech ranking for Milan
- Competitors to watch: Rome, Madrid, Oslo




- Very strong international reach into CEE and Mediterranean
- Strong image for internet startups
- Weaknesses with high-tech startups and maybe access to talent
- Competitors to watch: Lisbon, Barcelona, Amsterdam



- Comparably strong image for access to capital
- Slightly better performance in internet startups ranking
- Remarkable outreach to all regions of Europe
- Competitors to watch: Stockholm, Tallinn



- Excellent image as a hub for high-tech and access to capital
- Comparable low burnrate
- · Good international reach into CEE but little beyond
- Competitors to watch: Zurich, Stockholm



- Strong position in high-tech
- Weaknesses in access to capital and talent
- Not yet able to lead CEE, no reach at all to Nordics and Baltics
- Competitors to watch: Warsaw, Prague, Munich
